



Van Owners

Thames Valley Police is warning all van owners to be vigilant following a series of vans across the Wantage and Faringdon areas being targeted by thieves for their tools.

"Vehicle criminals are opportunists, and you can help to prevent vehicle-related crime by taking simple security measures.

"We urge people to take note and share our advice to stop more people becoming victim to this crime."

Thames Valley Police advice to help secure your van and its contents -

- Make sure you lock the doors and shut the windows whenever you leave your van unattended
- Never leave any valuables visible keep all possessions out of sight.
 Even if you know that there is nothing valuable in your jacket pocket or file left on the seat, a thief may try their luck
- Remove tools from your van when left overnight
- If removal of tools is not possible, fit a tool safe and ensure it is fully secure
- Consider parking your van close to a hedge or wall in order to restrict access for anyone trying to get inside. Always park your van in well-lit areas
- Engrave or mark tools and their box with your details. This can be down with a UV pen or permanent marker
- Fit additional external locks to van doors
- If you see any suspicious behaviour, please call 101

Bonfire night advice

Fireworks can cause serious damage or injury if not used correctly, so always follow the instructions. Keep them away from property, trees, fences, bushes or vehicles and always stand a safe distance away when setting them off.

An organised display is the best way to enjoy fireworks safely. If you do decide to have your own display remember:

- you must be over 18 to buy fireworks
- letting off a firework in a public place is an offence
- you are breaking the law if you let off fireworks between 11pm 7am (this is extended to midnight on Bonfire night)
- make sure fireworks conform to British Standards BS 7114, EN 14035 or EN 15947

Remember not to forget your pets. Keep them safe indoors and make sure they have a comfortable, quiet space to relax in.

Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

I have been reading the book *I married a soldier* by Brenda Hale, which was published this summer by LION.

It tells us of Brenda's experiences, both as an army wife and then as an army widow after her husband Captain Mark Hale died in Afghanistan. It ends with her re-election last year to Stormont in Northern Ireland, where she lives. They are selected experiences but include how both of them became Christians, how the family dealt with the disruption of separation and how subsequently they were coping with the devastation of bereavement.

The book brought back lots of memories for me, for I first met Mark when he was Company Sergeant Major of "A" company of the 1st Battalion Devon and Dorset Regiment when I joined the Army as a chaplain in 2000. I remember reading the Bible and praying with Mark in Crossmaglen, refereeing him in rugby matches; visiting the family in hospital after their second daughter was born and conducting her service of Blessing and Thanksgiving and Dedication at the little corrugated chapel in Cavalry Barracks, Hounslow where they attended.

Mark had a great care and sense of responsibility for his men, and it was while he was trying to save one of them that he was killed.

What this book makes clear, far better than I could is that it is not only the service personnel who make sacrifices, but also their families as well. It also conveys the anger, frustration and despair at the horror and waste of life that war causes. Brenda took those strong feelings and channelled them to make a positive difference.

Our national act of remembrance this month gives us an opportunity to show gratitude for the sacrifices made by sailors, soldiers and airmen, as well as their families; but it should also help us positively focus on striving to maintain freedom, security and peace.

As a Christian minister, I find myself returning to the phrase Jesus said —" ...no one has greater love than this that they lay down their life for their friends"; and finding hope in the belief that his sacrifice has begun the process to bring about the end of all war and conflict.

By the way if you are interested in reading this book you can buy a copy of it at Cornerstone bookshop in Grove.

We will remember them.

FOOTPATHS/RIGHTS OF WAY – COUNTY COUNCIL'S DEFINITIVE MAPS

In 2026 any historic footpaths/rights of way or ancient lanes that are not on the County Council's Definitive Maps will be lost forever.

Please seek out these routes, they may be used every day or hidden in the past, but after 2026 they will be gone forever! It is the public's responsibility to check these routes and apply to the OCC to have them added to the Definitive Map by way of a Definitive Map Modification Order (DMMO). Open Spaces Society are running two FREE training days to help people get started, anyone can do it, local historians, walkers, cyclist enthusiasts.

Free workshops for rights of way enthusiasts. The aim of these training events is to enthuse, enable and empower rights of way researchers to make definitive map modification order applications to ensure that rights that would be extinguished in 2026 are saved for future generations to use. 18 November 2017 Henley Town Hall, Henley On Thames, Oxon, RG9 2AQ Bookings & enquiries to Ellen Froggatt, e: ellenfroggatt@oss.org.uk

St Nicholas Church, East Challow Re-ordering project

An update on Church Alterations: Toilet, Entrance and Servery

The aim of the project is to make the church more welcoming, accessible and more usable for a wider range of church and village activities by sensitively introducing some modern facilities and making the building more compatible with the needs and expectations of the 21st century.

This involves providing a toilet suitable for disabled people, reorganising the entrance area, adding some basic catering facilities, and creating permanent independent disabled access via a steady slope up to the door. This will give easier access and better space inside for pushchairs etc as well as wheel chairs and will be more user - friendly for large gatherings at weddings, funerals etc.

Although we will do some parts of the work ourselves and we hope to raise some of the total from grants, there is still an urgent need for substantial direct giving, and fund raising. Any gifts, ideas or offers of help gratefully received .

The first phase in the work will be the work on the drain run that we are doing ourselves which will run from the church down to the village hall car park to access the drain from the Village Hall This has been agreed by the DAC, the Parish Council and the Village Hall Committee. The gradual slope of the path to the Church door to make access for wheel chairs and ambient disabled better will be done after the drain run has been installed.

The estimated cost is approx. £50,000
