166.1/25-26 Meeting held on 14th January 2026

153.2/25-26 To confirm the declared Value for Street Furniture adequately covers the street furniture assets in East Challow.

Resolved: The sum insured of £30,000 for street furniture was discussed, it was agreed that this would be changed at the renewal date on 01/06/26. This will be confirmed at the May

2026 meeting. The Clerk was asked to confirm if this was amount was standard block insurance or a declared value. **[ACTION CLERK]**

Response from Clear Councils received 20/01/26 Thank you for the below email. We can confirm that the £30,000 noted under the street furniture section is that standard declared value provided within this package policy.

Resolved: It was unanimously agreed to ask the Village Hall Committee for a yearly evaluation as they are paid £3,000 per year by the Parish Council. Cllr Crump will raise this at the next Village Hall Committee meeting. **[ACTION IC]** This was added to the Village Hall agenda.

168/25-26 Staffing Matters

168.1/25-26 To receive an update following the advertising of the Maintenance Warden post.

The Maintenance Warden post has been re advertised in Challow News, is on the Village Noticeboards and the Parish Council website, the closing date has been extended until 27th February 2026. It was confirmed that there had not been any interest from the job advert so far.

Resolved: It was noted that the Council had not received any interest. If no applications were received by 27th February, the Council agreed to re advertise the vacancy in May.

169.4/25-26 To receive a budget to actual/EMR report.

Both reports were received by the Councillors.

Resolved: The following was unanimously requested, agreed or noted.

Budget to actual

Clarification was requested for the payroll figure displayed for December this was different to the figure displayed for December on the January meeting budget to actual, the difference is £137 less. **[ACTION RFO]**

The Clerk pointed out that approx. £144 excluding VAT was still required for the setup of the Chair's laptop, the budget for IT software and support currently has £108.04.

The Challow News invoice of £250 has come from the subscriptions budget as this is paying for a page, this budget is in deficit by £130.00.

The Council are waiting for Bluestone Planning to invoice for the land registry information for Childrey Way, the Council approved that this would be taken from the professional/ legal fees budget and not the expenses for postage, copies and printing as previously agreed.

The Council noted that the £300 debited from the Grounds Maintenance budget in January is the money for refurbishment of the notice board and seat, this was previously approved as coming from the village improvements EMR. The Council agreed that this should remain as coming from the Grounds maintenance budget.

The electricity budget was discussed, the payment for August of £415.58 displayed on January budget to actual was not displayed this month. The Council requested more information on this. **[ACTION RFO]**

169.5/25-26 To receive dates for spending CIL money.

The following was noted by all Councillors.

£24,905.12 to be spent by 25/10/28

£33,499.33 to be spent by 24/10/29

It was also noted that the money for the Vicarage Hill Cemetery project and money for the pathway installation on the Village green would be spent from the CIL balances above. The new picnic bench for the recreation ground and the basketball backboards and nets would also be funded by CIL money.

169.6/25-26 To receive information regarding changing electricity supplier.

The RFO will continue to progress this. The RFO will be obtaining a meter reading and will then query the bill received for November from SSE for £224.25 **[ACTION RFO]**

169.7/25-26 To receive and approve the updated Asset Register.

The asset register is being reviewed by the Chair and will be given to the RFO for amendment in good time for this to be approved at the April meeting. **[ACTION CHAIR]**

169.8/25-26 To receive information and approve the opening of a savings account for the transfer of EMR's.

The RFO has reported that a Unity savings account maybe an option for holding EMR'S . The Council requested more information on interest rates and terms and conditions for the next meeting. **[ACTION RFO]**

169.9/25-26 To receive discuss and approve the invoice from Challow News.

Resolved: It was noted what a great resource the Challow News is for the Village, it was unanimously approved for the £250 invoice from Challow News, in respect of the Parish Council page, be paid on the February payments list.

169.10/25-26 To review and approve the letter of engagement from the 2026 Internal Auditor.

Resolved: The Councillors unanimously agreed to accept the terms of engagement, the Chair signed the letter as requested by the Internal Auditor. The Clerk was asked to return the signed letter to the Internal Auditor. **[ACTION CLERK]**

169.11/25-26 RFO report

Additionally, the RFO reported the pensions email was relating to 2025 whereas the previous return that was completed was 2022. The return for 2025 was completed online and on time 21st January 2026.

The Castle water account information was received by the Councillors; it was noted that the dates and figures were confusing. Clarification was requested if the Council are in debit or credit. **[ACTION RFO]**

The council confirmed that all staff are to be paid according to hours worked on the monthly time sheet and pro rata hours will be adjusted accordingly. The Council requested that the RFO complete the timesheet showing the calculation for the adjustment to pro rata hours using the timesheet received, if an employee does not have the software to use the Excel timesheet version.

170/25-26 Governance

170.1/25-26 To receive information from the computer consultant regarding the Council's website.

The consultant has considered the options and felt that going with the .gov.uk approach, via Parish Online would be a sensible option. Particularly if other Parish Councils have done this and not had major issues. The consultant advised to find out more from those that have facilitated the transfer for other Parish Councils to investigate cost.

Resolved: The meeting dates for 2026/2027 were unanimously approved, the Clerk was asked to send these to the Village Hall Bookings Secretary. **[ACTION CLERK]**

172.1/25-26 To note planning application

P26/V0171/LDP Location: Crown Packaging Plc Downsview Road Wantage OX12 9BP

Description: CERTIFICATE OF LAWFUL DEVELOPMENT FOR PROPOSED USE OR DEVELOPMENT

The proposal consists of replacing the existing fencing that is installed around the site's external car park, located to the north of the site's boundary. The proposed fencing would retain the same pedestrian access points as the existing installation. It would be installed on the same boundary line and at the same height. The only exception to this being that a reduced height 'Knee Rail' is proposed to replace the existing roadside one-metre-high fence installation at the east side of the car park. **No response required**

P26/V0246/DIS Location: Phase 7, Land At Grove Airfield Denchworth Road Grove
Description: Discharge of condition 19(tree protection) on application ref. P12/V0299/O in relation to Phase 7 only. Outline application for residential development of about 2,500 dwellings with associated services and facilities including secondary school, primary schools, local centre (including uses falling within use classes A1, A2, A3, A4, A5, B1, C2, D1 and D2), open space including community park, and the realignment of Denchworth Road to the south. **No response required.**

173/25-26 Village and surrounding area

173.1/25-26 To receive an update on the installation of a pathway on CL98.

The clerk has confirmed with ALH Landscaping that the works will start in March, earlier if possible. Councillors re approved the quotation from ALH Landscaping that now included VAT. The payment of the invoice was discussed; it was agreed that payment would be approved at the March meeting for payment between meetings once the invoice is received.

173.2/25-26 To receive an update on the ownership of the trees and land adjacent to the houses in Childrey Way

The Council have received some information from Bluestone Planning confirming that the area is owned by the Vale of the White Horse District Council. Following the Clerk sending emails to try and find out who would deal with this matter, advice has been received to contact the Parks Department at South and Vale District Council, regarding the trees obscuring the streetlights.

The Clerk has sent an email regarding the issue of the street lighting. It has been advised that the resident should liaise with South and Vale District Council as they are the owner of the trees in regard to the access to internet services. The Clerk was asked to email the resident passing on this information. **[ACTION CLERK]**

173.3/25-26 To receive an update on the replacement of fruit trees in the Community Orchard.

Cllr Barrow emailed the Tree Services Manager at OCC on 28th January to enquire who would deal with this matter, a response has not been received so far.

173.4/25-26 To receive information regarding the volunteer flood warden scheme.

OCC run the scheme and remain directly in contact with volunteers. They receive training from OCC that helps the volunteers understand who to report different flood risk to. There is no limit to the number of flood wardens that can volunteer.

Resolved: It was agreed that the Clerk should send the information to Challow News to appeal for volunteers.

173.5/25-26 To further discuss the request for railings on the steps on Letcombe Hill.

Resolved: It was noted that the railings had not been in place for some time, the Council resolved to firstly ascertain confirmation of land ownership via Bluestone Planning. The Councillors noted railings would be beneficial, as the steps are steep and go directly onto Letcombe Hill. **[ACTION CHAIR]**

173.6/25-26 To receive information regarding a building /construction consultant.

Fees for Glanville Engineering could be £50 to £200 per hour – they tend to do medium sized projects by professional developers.

For a pavilion project the Council would need:

Architect

Planning Consultant

Structural Engineer

Civil Engineer

Building services Engineer

The Council received information advising them to link up with an architect who may be able to lead the Council to a smaller consultancy that is used to doing smaller projects. It was suggested that the way forward would be to speak with some smaller design consultants to find out if they could help advise the Parish Council on design requirements for future projects. Planning applications could be checked to find other planning agents to approach for information.

174/25-26 Standing Agenda Items, to receive update and agree actions.

174.1/25-26 Parish Cemeteries.

To receive an update on the project to landscape areas and replace the hedge in the Vicarage Hill Cemetery to create more burial plots.

A quotation has been received from a contractor for the works in the Vicarage Hill Cemetery. They have included various options, these were received and discussed by the Councillors. It was noted that the quotation is valid for 12 months. The Chair and Cllr Hayes are progressing 2 other quotations.

To receive information regarding land registration of the Vicarage Hill Cemetery.

Following ICCM advice the Clerk and Chair are checking to ensure that the Vicarage Hill Cemetery is registered with Land Registry. The Clerk has ascertained that a title plan can be purchased for £7, the Chair is checking through paperwork to see if the Parish Council already have this information.

Resolved: The Councillors agreed unanimously to the expenditure of £7 for the copy of a title plan if needed.

The height of the beech hedge was discussed. It was suggested that the hedge needs reducing to 10ft and should be done before nesting birds in April. The Clerk was asked to approach the Grounds Maintenance contractor who maintains the hedge within the grounds maintenance schedules to further discuss this. The Clerk will endeavour to obtain further quotations for this work if necessary. **[ACTION CLERK]**

174.2/25-26 Allotments

Cllr Webb reported that two allotments are now in the process of being reallocated.

174.3/25-26 Traffic/Highways including:

Parking within the village

The parking issue on Hedge hill road continue to cause access and visibility problems. It was also noted that the verges in Windmill Place are muddy due to vehicles parking.

Speeding within the Village/ an update on the setting up of a Community Speedwatch Team.

A request for CSW volunteers was published in Challow News and is on the noticeboards, from this we have had 2 volunteers. It was noted that this was not enough and the volunteer request would be re advertised in Challow News and put on the East Challow Residents and Nalderfields Facebook pages. **[ACTION CHAIR]**

The Clerk was asked to check with Clear Councils to check volunteer insurance for the CSW team, this response was received on 21/01/26.

We can confirm that the volunteers will be covered under the Employers Liability section of the policy. Please ensure that risk assessments are carried out.

Employees and Volunteers should be between the ages of 16-80 years and must be physically fit and able to carry out the work expected of them in order for them to be covered by the Personal Accident Section of the Policy. Anyone under the age of 16 will require an adult to be present and will require parental permission.

Cllr Gregson has emailed OCCH regarding the re positioning of the school children crossing sign at the foot of Letcombe Hill. A response has been received from OCCH confirming that the sign is in the correct location and is directly in a driver's vision when approaching Letcombe Hill. OCCH feel the resident should be asked to cut back the vegetation that is partially obscuring the sign. Cllr Gregson has confirmed that the Parish Council will request the resident to cut back the vegetation, Cllr Gregson has requested that the road signage is re marked on the road at both ends of Letcombe Hill, it has been confirmed that this has been

added to OCCH 's work schedules. Cllr Barrow will be asked to speak with the resident regarding the vegetation. **[ACTION PB]**

Cllr Gregson has discussed speed humps to reduce the speed on Letcombe Hill, he has been advised by OCCH that the Parish Council would be required to pay for these. Cllr Gregson is finding out an estimate of cost.

The Chair and Vice Chair reported that the recreation ground and school sign that was located on the grassed area in Windmill Place, where the road meets Sarajac Ave has appeared again and needs to be re-erected. It was noted that the sign is owned by OCC. Cllr Gregson will contact OCCH and request that the sign is re-erected. **[ACTION AG]**

Speed Indicator Displays (SID's).

Cllr Gregson reported that both the SIDs were working.

174.4/25-26 Grounds Maintenance

To receive an update on the 2026/2027 Grounds Maintenance contracts.

The Clerk has prepared and sent the contracts to both contractors. Risk assessments are undergoing review by the contractors. The Contracts will be signed in readiness to start on the 1st March.

174.5/25-26 Public Art

To receive an update on the preparation of the time capsule.

Cllr Hayes has discussed ideas with some children from St Nicholas School, it is hoped that the time capsule will be prepared and ready for installation after the SATs tests in May. It was noted that a cost for installation, of the time capsule, will be obtained from the contractor who installed the sign once it is prepared.

174.6/25-26 Recreation Areas

To receive a report from the Pavilion Working Group.

A meeting was held on 02/02/2026 the main points from this meeting.

- Challow Sports reported that solder joints on some old pipework were leaking, it was confirmed that the water pipes had not frozen inside the toilet. Challow Sports are managing this, opening up the toilet when required and turning the water off immediately after use. Challow Sports will be repairing the pipework.
- The external light on a timer request will not be going ahead.
- It was acknowledged that the doors had become swollen due to the wet weather, Challow Sports have adjusted the doors and are monitoring the ease of use.
- It was confirmed that as per the Parish Council's Grounds Maintenance contracts the recreation grass is cut every 2 weeks from March till October. Challow Sports agreed that they would cut the grass in between the scheduled cuts if required.

Challow Sports would like a compost area to be agreed by the Parish Council for the disposal of grass cuttings.

- It was confirmed that the original goalpost would be removed by Challow Sports during the summer and the holes will be back filled.
- There are holes appearing on the pitch made by rabbits and dogs, Challow Sports are filling these with topsoil as agreed as per Challow Sports agreement. Work will be carried out on the muddy area under one of the current fixed goal posts.
- Electrics need to be completed, some internal painting to be done and the carpet taken out of the right-side changing room.
- Challow Sports mentioned the possibility of leasing the pavilion from the Parish Council in the future.
- A meeting will be held with representatives of the beavers/cubs regarding the pavilion and pavilion working group. It was agreed that the Parish Council representatives on the Pavilion Working group will be present. Challow Sports will advise the Clerk when this will be taking place.

Resolved: It was agreed that grass cuttings could be spread along the northern edge of the recreation ground.

To receive an update on the full electrical safety inspection check at the Pavilion.

Challow Sports reported that work had now been done to the electrical system. Wiring that would not be compliant with the current electrical regulations has been found and rectified. There are 2 jobs outstanding that are now planned to be completed. Challow Sports will notify the Clerk once these are complete. Cllr Gregson will contact the electrical contractor who had previously offered to carry out the electrical inspection. The Clerk was asked to email Challow Sports and clarify if the works are now complete. **[ACTION AG/ CLERK]**

To receive a report following the visual play inspection checks.

A quarterly inspection was carried out on the 28/01/26, the main points were.

The surface around the seat is deteriorating.

The roller Barrel is not silent.

Moss needs removing from the multiplay surface

The gaps around the edge of both swing wet pours should be filled with topsoil and natural vegetation allowed to grow to reduce tripping hazards.

The Clerk has contacted Wicksteed again to ask if there is any remedial work, they are prepared to do following the laying of the wet pours and the edges not growing. The Clerk received confirmation that Wicksteed will be attending to lay topsoil and grass seed to the edges of the wetpours.

The quarterly report has been sent to the Environmental Warden.

To agree a location and the purchase of seats/picnic benches for the recreation ground.

Challow Sports felt that a picnic bench placed on the mound would be a good location.

Challow Sports raised concerns regarding installing a recycled plastic picnic bench.

Resolved: Three quotations were received and considered. It was agreed unanimously that the Clifton Picnic table would be purchased. This will be ordered once the base is in place. It was agreed that a rounded edge 300MM deep base was required, 150 mm type 1 and 150mm concrete. The Clerk was asked to obtain quotations for the base. **[ACTION CLERK]**

To receive information regarding the repair/replacement of the basketball nets.

At the October 2025 PC meeting, minute reference **104/25-26** Correspondence was received from a Parishioner requesting the basketball hoops on the MUGA be repaired.

Resolved: It was agreed unanimously that the basketball hoops should be repaired. The Clerk was asked to write to the Parishioner informing them that MUGA/tennis court will be closed from November, the Parish Council would endeavour to repair the nets in readiness for the spring re opening. **[ACTION CLERK]** `

The Clerk has gained 1 quotation for £795 ex VAT, this is to replace 2 backboards and install 2 nets to the existing hoops and clear arisings from site. As this is above £500 The Clerk is endeavouring to obtain another 2 quotations.

To receive and discuss the request from Challow Sports for the use of the MUGA.

Challow Sports have requested to use the MUGA on a Thursday evening every week from 17:30 – 19:00 for Netball training for children year 3 and upwards. It has been confirmed by Challow Sports Netball this will be for training only, if games were played another local court would be hired. Challow sports confirmed they would be advertising via St Nicholas School and on the East Challow Resident's Facebook page to encourage participation from children in East Challow. It is intended to play netball across the width of the court, allowing 2 training session to take place at the same time. The tennis net will not need to be removed for the training. It was confirmed by Challow Sports that Each netball player will have their own insurance, 10 million Public Liability and personal accident from paying an individual subscription to Netball England via Challow Sports. Challow Sports confirmed that they would be supplying the netball posts. Challow Sports also confirmed that 3 DBS checked coaches will be running the sessions.

Resolved: The Council agreed to a trial 6-month, an agreement will be put in place. The Council agreed to the court being used from 30th March 2026. It will be noted on the agreement the court will close on 25th October 2026. The Clerk was asked to prepare an agreement to be reviewed and approved by the Council at the March Parish Council meeting. **[ACTION CLERK]**

175/25-26 To receive Correspondence and agree actions or approve responses.

Correspondence has been received from the Head of Planning at VWHDC regarding Planning training on 26th February and 3rd March 2026. Each Town and Parish Council have been allocated 2 places. An email was sent to all Cllrs on 19/01/26 as attendance needs to be

confirmed by 02/02/26. Cllr Webb confirmed that she would like to attend the session on the 26th February. the Clerk was asked to book this place. **[ACTION CLERK]**

Correspondence has been received from Challow and Childrey Cricket Club requesting support for their claim for S106 money to install an artificial wicket. This project is in collaboration with King Alfred's School. The Councillors unanimously agreed to add their support to the request for S106 money. The Clerk was asked to send an email to the infrastructure implementation officer to register this support. **[ACTION CLERK]**

Correspondence has been received from Citizens Advice Oxfordshire thanking the Parish Council for the £75 grant. This was noted.

Correspondence has been received regarding SESRO- White Horse Reservoir regarding an invitation to attend an update briefing for Councillors on Thursday 5th March, from 2pm to 4pm. The project team will be available to provide a summary of the Statutory Consultation responses, and next steps, as they move towards submission of the Development Consent Order (DCO), along with the opportunity to answer questions. The briefing will be held at the reservoir site office at the Steventon Storage Facility on the Hanney Road. This was noted.

Correspondence has been received from Challow Sports asking for permission for the following event.

- **Event name:** Challow Sports End of Season Presentation
- **Location:** East Challow Recreational Ground
- **Proposed date & time:** Sunday 12th July - 15:00pm - 20:00pm (after school fete)
- **Expected attendance:** 90 approx.
- **Event purpose:** Club Event
- **Activities planned:** Presentation with speaker, BBQ, music (not loud), sports activities (rounders/football/games)

Resolved: It was agreed to gain more information about the following event. Concerns were raised regarding the lack of facilities on the recreation ground for approx 90 people. The Council agreed that BBQ's would not be permitted, Challow Sports would need to hire toilet facilities and remove their own rubbish. Parking was also a concern for the event and that alcohol would be available on the recreation ground. The clerk was asked to email Challow Sports to request more information. This will be discussed again at the next Parish Council meeting. **[ACTION CLERK]**

Correspondence has been received from South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse District Councils reporting that the government has launched a consultation on options to reorganise local councils across Oxfordshire and West Berkshire. Local Government Reorganisation is a government-led reform to change how councils in two-tier areas are

structured, replacing county and district councils with single unitary structures responsible for local services. The upcoming consultation asks residents for their views on each of the three proposals put forward for Oxfordshire. The consultation is open from 5 February to 26 March 2026. Respondents can either take part in an online survey or write directly to government with their views. The Clerk was asked to put this in Challow News.

The Chair reported that Cllr Golden has resigned as a Parish Councillor with effect from 12/02/26. This was noted by all Councillors. The Chair asked for it to be noted that Cllr Golden was thanked for his support for the Community during his time as Parish Councillor. The Clerk will advise Elections South and Vale. **[ACTION CLERK]**

176/25-26 Matters for future discussion.

Sustainable Wantage have received the data that they required. The Council will receive a report at a later date.
